NHPC offers improved agricultural seeds to people affected by the project

Improving NHPC's support to PAPs

As part of the Nachtigal project's Resettlement Action Plan (RAP), improved seeds are to be provided to people affected by the project (PAPs) who have been affected by areas of less or more than 1,000 m². For the 2024 agricultural campaign, 181 PAPs in dam, high-voltage line and housing estate (LHT+CE) zones benefited from a donation of improved agricultural seeds worth 27,820,220 FCFA, in April 2024, provided by the Agricultural Research and Development Institute (IRAD).

Made up of cocoa, banana, basil, tomato, nightshade, celery and lettuce, these seeds were identified by the PAPs during field interviews conducted by NHPC's Environmental and Social Department teams, with the aim of improving the company's support for people affected by the project.

In accordance with the agricultural schedule, these beneficiary PAPs directly planted their seeds and will benefit from technical monitoring to help them obtain maximum benefit from these seeds.
