NHPC continues to support young people in the Nachtigal project area

Football holiday championships organized in the Nachtigal project area

For the fourth time since 2021, NHPC has sponsored the holiday football championships organized by the councils of the Nachtigal project area.

From July 27th to September 7th, 2024, the localities of Mbandjock, Batchenga, Ntui, Obala, Sa'a and Ebebda have each welcome their tournaments. From players to supporters, including administrative and traditional authorities, this major annual event mobilized more than 2000 people from the Nachtigal project area.

As an official sponsor, NHPC provided all the teams, their technical staff and referees with sports uniforms, provided all the sports equipment necessary for the organization of the matches (balls, whistles, stopwatches, refereeing cards, medals, trophies, etc.) and refreshments and promoted the championships through communication supports.

Sport, a lever for the promotion of youth

Sport, and specifically football, which is very popular in Cameroon, had been identified in socio-economic surveys carried out in 2019 as a vector of social cohesion. The sponsorship of the holiday football championships was then immediately included in the youth promotion programme set up by NHPC as part of its Local Economic Development Action Plan ("PADEL" in French).

This programme that was launched in 2021 and ends this year includes besides championships' organization other activities such as the construction of community homes to host social events, the financial or material support for youth associations and the support for socio-cultural events organized by the local populations.

Through the "PADEL", NHPC is committed to supporting young people in the Nachtigal project area and making them actors in the economic development of their respective territories.
